Happy Spring Tri-Par Residents,

With the March election now behind us, I would like to congratulate re-elected Park Trustees Mark Wright and Daryle vonHoldt and newly-elected Trustee Jackie Hunter. Per our by-laws, a special meeting of the Board was held on April 2nd. Mark Wright was elected as Chairman, Mike Neff as 1st Vice Chair, Dan Via as 2nd Vice Chair, Maureen Lafortune as Secretary and Laurie Legler as Treasurer.

Thanks to the Flea Market, we have a new exercise bike in the gym. Best of all, the new Spirit CR800 recumbent bike's display works off the power you generate, so it does not need power from an outlet.

There will be a Health Fair here on Friday, May 3rd in the Clubhouse from 10-1. It's free to park residents and will have entertainment, door prizes and raffles along with doctors and medical specialists to answer your questions.

The two prominent items on park inspection are mold/ algae on homes and cars parked on the grass. I know we live in a tight space, but please be aware of your neighbors. We still have the power washer available for free to any resident who wants to take advantage of it.

Finally!!! The new spa and deck project is ready to go with permits, color selections, and scheduling in place. The construction is scheduled to start in April or May. Once complete, we will look to add the third gate, new fencing on the south side and more parking for golf carts.

Highlights of the new 2024-25 park budget approved includes \$15,000 for parking lot repairs, \$6,000 for fencing, \$9,000 to start a design of the clubhouse kitchen. \$13,500 to replace 2 more A/C units and 16,500 for the common areas. More importantly, there will be NO INCREASE in park assessments for 2024-2025. The 5year plan is on the Park website for anyone interested.

Meet Mary and Coleman Nee. They have been married for 65 years. They were honored for 17 years of service volunteering to help cook the New England/Canada dinners. Mary received a bouquet of flowers and had spent all 17 years in the kitchen helping to prepare meals. She had only nice things to say about preparing all those meals; she said everyone around her worked as a team.

Hailing from Ireland, both Mary and Coleman immigrated to the Boston area. Mary was sponsored by her uncle but it was through her aunt that she met Coleman. Many of the Irish immigrants would meet on a regular basis at her aunt's house and attend dances together. That is where she met Coleman, and they were engaged within five months and married a year later.

Their first business venture began at a VFW hall selling pizza, hot dogs, and hamburgers. Eventually, they owned a seafood restaurant called Hosey's By the Sea. At the same time, Coleman drove a truck from Boston to Buffalo and back; many times it was a semi-truck with two trailers. They raised eight children who all helped work in the restaurant and now have families of their own. They have 13 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

Through Peg Mansfield, who knew Coleman's sister, Mary and Coleman were introduced to Tri-Par. They found a house to rent in 1998 and bought 4745 TriPar Drive the same year. For six years, they were snowbirds, and then they bought a home in

Bradenton and rented their Tri-Par home. While renting out their home, they continued to take part in Tri-Par activities. They love the gym, the dances and go to coffees and, of course, the New England/Canada dinners. In 2020, they sold the Bradenton home and are permanent residents in their Tri-Par home.

Mexican Street Corn

If you're celebrating Cinco de Mayo, grilled Mexican Street Corn and Guacamole will complete your meal! Cinco de Mayo commemorates Mexico's unexpected victory over France in the Battle of Puebla on May 5, 1862.

Ingredients:

- 3 ears of sweet corn
- 3 Tbs. mayonnaise
- 1/4 tsp. garlic powder
- 1/2 cup cotija cheese, crumbled
- 3 Tbs. cilantro, chopped
- 1/2 tsp. chipotle chili power
- 1 lime, quartered

Directions:

- 1. Grill corn (with or without husks). If you remove the husks you can have pretty grill marks. If you bake in oven, leave husks on and bake 35-40 min. in 350°oven.
- 2. In a small bowl, combine the garlic powder with the mayonnaise. Place the cotija cheese in a shallow baking dish. When the corn is done, brush corn with the garlic mayonnaise. Roll in the cotija cheese and sprinkle with cilantro and chili powder.
- 3. Serve with the lime wedge to squeeze over the corn.



Olivia's Guacamole

Guacamole dates back to the Aztec Empire in Central America during the 1500s. National Guacamole Day is celebrated on Sept. 16 – the same day as Mexican Independence Day.

Ingredients:

- 2 avocados
- 3-4 Tbs. Parmesan cheese
- 3-5 tsps. salt
- 1 tomato
- 1 onion
- 2 Tbs. cilantro

Directions:

- 1. Remove skin from avocados and put in mixing bowl.
- **2.** Add Parmesan cheese, salt, 1/2 tomato and 1/2 onion to the bowl.
- **3.** Mix however you like! Mix more if you want creamy or less if you want chunky.

KNOW THE RULES

State Laws

Florida Golf Cart Laws

Effective October 1, 2023, Chapter 2023-67, L.O.F. (CS/CS/HB 949) required that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must:

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver's license.

Sarasota County

Contracting/Licensed Contractors

Any new structure or improvements to an existing structure must be performed by a State of Florida or locally-registered Sarasota County contractor. Owner-builders can perform work with the applicable permit. To report suspected unlicensed contracting or activity, please call 941-861-5000 or Crime Stoppers at 941-366-TIPS (8477); you may remain anonymous.

ALERT Sarasota County --- REPLACES Code Red Warning System

Sarasota County has switched from Code RED to a new alert system for emergency alerts for items such as water main breaks, weather warnings, etc.

Sarasota County Code Highlights

- Junk, Trash and Debris: Prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to wood, tires, automobile parts, hazardous waste, abandoned property, unusable or discarded household items, inoperative or discarded machinery or equipment, motor vehicles and trailers, which are inoperative or lack current license tags, solid waste, construction or demolition materials.
- *Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles*: All vehicles must be operable and have current license tags or must be stored in a completely enclosed building.
- **Overweight Vehicles**: Parking, servicing repair and storage of trucks, buses, vans, and tractor trailers in excess of 6,000 pounds vehicle empty weight is prohibited in residential or open use districts.
- Living in Motor Homes or RVs in Residential Areas: It shall not be used for living, sleeping, housekeeping or business purposes and shall not be hooked to any utilities.
- **Building Permits**: Before the start of any construction or structural repair, check with the County permitting Office (861-6678) to ensure if a permit is required.

- Household Garbage and Yard Waste: All waste must be in trash cans, plastic bags or tied bundles, weighing no more than 40 pounds. Put containers out no sooner than 5 pm on the day before pickup (Sunday) and remove them by 10 am the day after (Tuesday). All containers are to be stored inside or rear yards only. You must separate yard waste from solid waste.
- **Household Hazardous Waste**: Except for motor oil and filters, hazardous waste is not collected at the curb. You must bring these types of items to a collection center, neighborhood collection or community collection program for proper disposal.
- Appliances: Residents may call the Tri-Par Scrap Pickers (Flea Market) to schedule a pick-up for an appliance or scrap metal. Please call Brad at 617-548-3343 for pick up.

Call the Sarasota Call Center (all violations) at 941-861-5000 or Code Enforcement at 941-861-6403 to report a violation of these codes.

Recycling

We are all aware of the need to cut down on our trash and the impact it has on our environment. Some activities you can undertake to reduce the impact of the waste you produce:

Waste Prevention: Avoid buying more than you need. Print only documents and emails that must be legally stored in paper form.

Waste Reduction: Avoid products with excessive packaging. Buy loose vegetables instead of pre-packed goods.

Reuse: Repurpose plastic bags. Find creative ways to transform used containers into home storage bins.

Recycle: We are all recycling in our homes, but sometimes find we are attending or running meetings or social events where the building does not have recycling facilities. (Such as our Tri-Par Clubhouse) Club leaders can arrange to have cardboard items, pop cans and steel cans taken home so that these articles can be recycled

Dogs and Cats

Sarasota County Ordinance Chapter 14 contains the regulations concerning pets and other animals. These regulations contribute to the well-being of the pets in our community and, therefore, to the well-being of us all.

- Each year you must obtain a license certificate and tag for your dog or cat. In order to receive the license, your
 pet must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The official county license may be attached
 to a collar or harness and must be worn by a dog or cat at all times.
- Your dog or cat may not run at large on any public property or the property of another and must be under the
 direct control of a responsible person. Direct control always means immediate and continuous physical control
 of an animal (dog or cat) by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal.
- Under no circumstances shall a person improperly tether any animal. It is unlawful to tether an animal
 outdoors, except when all 10 conditions (listed in Sarasota County Code of Ordinances, Section 14-35) are met.
 The most important condition is, "The Animal is in visual range of the Owner, and the Owner is located outside
 with the Animal."
- There have been instances when individuals are frightened by the behavior of our animals. If this occurs to you or you observe anything listed above, please report the incident to Animal Services at 941-861-9500.

F.I.S.H. Transportation (Free Medical Transportation)

Free medical transportation (via automobile) for Sarasota residents only. Donations are accepted. Rides available in the Sarasota area only. Transportation is for medical appointments only. MUST call to schedule 48 hours ahead and appointments must be between 9 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Phone: 941-953-5838

Tri-Par Policies and Procedures

Background Check for New Owners, Renters, or Caregivers and Guests Who Stay More Than 30 Days

Background checks are required for all first-time buyers, renters, or caregivers in Tri-Par Estates. A background check is also required for first-time guests staying more than 30 days. Renters, caregivers, and guests who have left the Park for 12 months or more must reapply for a background check. A per person application form and per person \$50.00 fee must be submitted to the Tri-Par Office a minimum of 30 days prior to the desired occupancy date for processing and the Board's action. The new application form is available in the Office.

Board Approval is Required Before Moving into Tri-Par Estates

If a renter, buyer, or caregiver moves in without the Board's prior approval, the first action will be to start the process to assess a fine against the owner in accordance with Section 22 of our deed restrictions. Secondly, unapproved renters or owners will be required to vacate the property and leave the park. If they refuse and it becomes necessary for legal action to remove the unapproved occupant(s), the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to recover all costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees (Section 21 of Deed Restrictions) from the property owner.

Use of Tri-Par Pool and Spa

Adult supervision is required for children under 12 years of age when at all areas of the Pool. No one under 16 is permitted in the Spa. Pool and Spa rules are posted at the pool area.

Speed Limit in Tri-Par

The speed limit throughout our Park is 20 MPH. We have many walkers, bikers, and people on their golf carts every day. For the safety of all our residents, please do your part in observing the speed limit. If you have guests, let them know we would very much appreciate their maintaining the 20 MPH speed limit within the Park.
