We are still waiting for Sarasota County to issue the permit so that work on the new Hot tub and deck area can commence. We hope to have all the permits soon so the new equipment and pavers can be installed.

The Flea Market continues to be very profitable and a great socialization event on Friday mornings. For January, we had sales of \$6,307 from all operations (\$4,277—Store, \$1,075-Scrap and \$975 online!) As always, we truly appreciate our very dedicated volunteers for their ongoing sorting and scrapping commitment and to all the folks who continue to support this effort in various ways.

Our residents are very generous in their donations; know that you are appreciated! We do need your help in spreading the word as new residents don't always understand how the work we do benefits our organization. Please help us inform our residents to consider donation to the Flea Market before bringing to Goodwill or Salvation Army as all funds go directly back to our organization, and if we can't sell the items, then we donate them.

What some of you may not realize is that we have really been able to capitalize with the integration of the scrap and store operation into one group. So, when you put items on the scrap trailer or call the scrap truck for pickup, we review the donations and decide if something is salvageable for sale versus sending to the scrap yard. One example is awnings. Previously, we would get a few dollars for scrapping an awning; now, we get \$10 per foot so a 6-foot awning would reap an additional profit of \$55 from selling. Refrigerators or stoves that are still in working condition bring in \$75-\$100 versus \$6-\$7. We really do work together to make as much profit as possible for you while still providing a real bargain and service to our customers.

Donations we are seeking include: household items, small furniture, jewelry, lamps, holiday décor, pictures, crafts, collectibles, clothes, shoes, linens, tools, electronics, flat screen TVs, small appliances, throw pillows, etc. Please ensure that donations are in saleable condition — **no broken, torn, stained or unclean items**. We are also unable to accept bed pillows, sleeper sofas, large old TV stands, mattresses, toilets, old style TVs, computers, books, printers and excessively heavy items.

Guiness Corned Beef & Cabbage

Everyone's Irish on March 17th!

Irish Americans transformed St. Patrick's Day from a religious feast day to a celebration of their heritage and homeland. With the celebration came a celebratory meal, splurging on flavorful corned beef, potato and the most affordable vegetable, cabbage. It didn't take long before corned beef and cabbage became associated with St. Patrick's Day. Maybe it was on Abraham Lincoln's mind when he chose the menu for his first_Inaugural Luncheon on March 4, 1861, which was corned beef, cabbage and potatoes!

Ingredients:

- 4 lbs. corned beef brisket
- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1-2 bottles of Guiness
- Wedge of cabbage, new potatoes, onion, carrots

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 300°
- 2. Rinse brisket thoroughly, pat dry and place in roasting pan. Rub brown sugar all over brisket. Pour 1 bottle of Guiness around and over brisket to wet sugar.
- 3. Bake, covered, in preheated oven until tender (~2½ hours 190°F) Allow to rest 5 minutes before slicing.
- 4. During the last hour of cooking, add cabbage, potatoes, onion and/or carrots and a little more beer as necessary.



IRISH SHORTBREAD TOFFEE BARS

As Julia Child always said, "You can't have too much butter."

Ingredients for Shortbread:

- 2 sticks (1 cup) salted butter (room temp)
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 2 cups flour

Ingredients for Toffee & Finishing:

- 2 sticks (1 cup) salted butter (room temp)
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 cups flour
- 1 (14-oz) can sweetened condensed milk
- 3 Tbs. maple syrup
- 1 (10-oz) bag chocolate chips
- Sea salt (optional)

Directions for Shortbread:

- 1. Preheat oven to 350°
- 2. Beat butter and sugar together until fluffy
- 3. Add flour & beat on low until crumbly (do not overmix dough).
- 4. Transfer to 8 x 11 baking dish, and back until golden brown (18-20 minutes)

Directions for Toffee:

- 1. Place butter, sugar, condensed milk and maple sugar in medium pan and bring to boil, stirring constantly, until thickened (5-7 minutes).
- 2. Pour over shortbread and let sit until set (at least 1 hour or overnight).
- 3. Melt chocolate chips over low heat and pour over cooled caramel.
- 4. Sprinkle with sea salt, if desired, and cool.

KNOW THE RULES

State Laws

Florida Golf Cart Laws

Effective October 1, 2023, Chapter 2023-67, L.O.F. (CS/CS/HB 949) required that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must:

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver's license.

Sarasota County

Contracting/Licensed Contractors

Any new structure or improvements to an existing structure must be performed by a State of Florida or locally-registered Sarasota County contractor. Owner-builders can perform work with the applicable permit. To report suspected unlicensed contracting or activity, please call 941-861-5000 or Crime Stoppers at 941-366-TIPS (8477); you may remain anonymous.

ALERT Sarasota County --- REPLACES Code Red Warning System

Sarasota County has switched from Code RED to a new alert system for emergency alerts for items such as water main breaks, weather warnings, etc.

Sarasota County Code Highlights

- Junk, Trash and Debris: Prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to wood, tires, automobile parts, hazardous waste, abandoned property, unusable or discarded household items, inoperative or discarded machinery or equipment, motor vehicles and trailers, which are inoperative or lack current license tags, solid waste, construction or demolition materials.
- *Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles*: All vehicles must be operable and have current license tags or must be stored in a completely enclosed building.
- **Overweight Vehicles**: Parking, servicing repair and storage of trucks, buses, vans, and tractor trailers in excess of 6,000 pounds vehicle empty weight is prohibited in residential or open use districts.
- Living in Motor Homes or RVs in Residential Areas: It shall not be used for living, sleeping, housekeeping or business purposes and shall not be hooked to any utilities.
- **Building Permits**: Before the start of any construction or structural repair, check with the County permitting Office (861-6678) to ensure if a permit is required.

- Household Garbage and Yard Waste: All waste must be in trash cans, plastic bags or tied bundles, weighing no more than 40 pounds. Put containers out no sooner than 5 pm on the day before pickup (Sunday) and remove them by 10 am the day after (Tuesday). All containers are to be stored inside or rear yards only. You must separate yard waste from solid waste.
- **Household Hazardous Waste**: Except for motor oil and filters, hazardous waste is not collected at the curb. You must bring these types of items to a collection center, neighborhood collection or community collection program for proper disposal.
- Appliances: Residents may call the Tri-Par Scrap Pickers (Flea Market) to schedule a pick-up for an appliance or scrap metal. Please call Brad at 617-548-3343 for pick up.

Call the Sarasota Call Center (all violations) at 941-861-5000 or Code Enforcement at 941-861-6403 to report a violation of these codes.

Recycling

We are all aware of the need to cut down on our trash and the impact it has on our environment. Some activities you can undertake to reduce the impact of the waste you produce:

Waste Prevention: Avoid buying more than you need. Print only documents and emails that must be legally stored in paper form.

Waste Reduction: Avoid products with excessive packaging. Buy loose vegetables instead of pre-packed goods.

Reuse: Repurpose plastic bags. Find creative ways to transform used containers into home storage bins.

Recycle: We are all recycling in our homes, but sometimes find we are attending or running meetings or social events where the building does not have recycling facilities. (Such as our Tri-Par Clubhouse) Club leaders can arrange to have cardboard items, pop cans and steel cans taken home so that these articles can be recycled

Dogs and Cats

Sarasota County Ordinance Chapter 14 contains the regulations concerning pets and other animals. These regulations contribute to the well-being of the pets in our community and, therefore, to the well-being of us all.

- Each year you must obtain a license certificate and tag for your dog or cat. In order to receive the license, your
 pet must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The official county license may be attached
 to a collar or harness and must be worn by a dog or cat at all times.
- Your dog or cat may not run at large on any public property or the property of another and must be under the
 direct control of a responsible person. Direct control always means immediate and continuous physical control
 of an animal (dog or cat) by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal.
- Under no circumstances shall a person improperly tether any animal. It is unlawful to tether an animal
 outdoors, except when all 10 conditions (listed in Sarasota County Code of Ordinances, Section 14-35) are met.
 The most important condition is, "The Animal is in visual range of the Owner, and the Owner is located outside
 with the Animal."
- There have been instances when individuals are frightened by the behavior of our animals. If this occurs to you or you observe anything listed above, please report the incident to Animal Services at 941-861-9500.

Tri-Par Policies and Procedures

Background Check for New Owners, Renters, or Caregivers and Guests Who Stay More Than 30 Days

Background checks are required for all first-time buyers, renters, or caregivers in Tri-Par Estates. A background check is also required for first-time guests staying more than 30 days. Renters, caregivers, and guests who have left the Park for 12 months or more must reapply for a background check. A per person application form and per person \$50.00 fee must be submitted to the Tri-Par Office a minimum of 30 days prior to the desired occupancy date for processing and the Board's action. The new application form is available in the Office.

Board Approval is Required Before Moving into Tri-Par Estates

If a renter, buyer, or caregiver moves in without the Board's prior approval, the first action will be to start the process to assess a fine against the owner in accordance with Section 22 of our deed restrictions. Secondly, unapproved renters or owners will be required to vacate the property and leave the park. If they refuse and it becomes necessary for legal action to remove the unapproved occupant(s), the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to recover all costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees (Section 21 of Deed Restrictions) from the property owner.

Use of Tri-Par Pool and Spa

Adult supervision is required for children under 14 years of age when at all areas of the Pool. No one under 16 is permitted in the Spa. Pool and Spa rules are posted at the pool area.

Speed Limit in Tri-Par

The speed limit throughout our Park is 20 MPH. We have many walkers, bikers, and people on their golf carts every day. For the safety of all our residents, please do your part in observing the speed limit. If you have guests, let them know we would very much appreciate their maintaining the 20 MPH speed limit within the Park.
