Hello Tri-Par Residents,

Frontier finished the fiber in the Park earlier than anticipated and will start the Wi-Fi installation for those currently living here. The procedure, with the phone number to call, should be on the Tri-Par website, Facebook and Channel 196 by the time you receive this newsletter. Direct-TV Cable will not be available until November, so you may not want to cancel your Comcast just yet.

Our two new front office employees have started and are learning fast. They are job-sharing, so it will not be uncommon to see a different person every time you come in. Please stop in and welcome Maria and Karen to the Tri-Par family.

We hope to have plans finalized for the renovation of the old solar array area next to the pool by sometime in October. We will be expanding the paved area toward the South fence and possibly putting in a new spa and Tiki hut to add shade with a third gate and golf cart parking near the putt-putt course.

Maintenance has started replacing the ceiling tiles and lights in the offices and conference room.

Tri-Par received a grant to replace tie-downs on older homes (1999 and older). The grant comes through Gulf Coast College, and the work will be performed by Top-Notch Mobile Homes. They are currently evaluating the Park and when finished will get information to the homeowners who are eligible for the program. The grant covers removing/replacing skirting and new tiedowns at no cost to the homeowner.

Meet Jim and Rose Phelps. Drive by their home at 1855 Brook Field Terrace and check out their flowers. Rose brought her geraniums from Illinois. She recommends using potting soil, Miracle Grow for fertilizer and lots of water to make them grow. Oh yeah, make sure the front of your house faces south! It helps to have a professional landscaper in the family but Rose swears she does all the work herself.

Rose's parents were in Tri-Par since 1987, and her Aunt and Uncle lived here too. Jim and Rose would bring their family down during spring break and especially over Christmas vacation. They bought their Tri-Par house in 1999 and rented it to different relatives over the years. It was a vacation home with their relatives taking good care of it.

Jim and Rose are snowbirds for five months of the year and spend the rest of the year in Plainfield, Illinois, southwest of Chicago. Jim is the professional landscaper even though their son has taken over the business. Going out to make bids, Jim gets to do the fun parts of the job and considers himself semi-retired. He graduated from Joliet High School after growing up on a farm. He attended two years of Joliet Junior Community College, (JJCC). After JJCC, he completed his undergraduate work at the University of Illinois and majored in agriculture. For 17 years, he was a vocational agriculture teacher, working 11 months out of the year - checking on students and making sure they had a job. It was a rural school and by age 30, after teaching landscaping to adults at JJCC, he realized he could be a professional landscaper and started his own business. For 10 years, he taught and ran the landscaping business. At age 40, he quit teaching and devoted his time to his business. Up until this time, he had reinvested his landscaping profits into more equipment, while not paying himself a salary, and working nights and weekends and summers. He could also hire some of his students and teach them how to run a business. He began to hire outside full time workers and that's when Jim and Rose took some time for Spanish lessons at JJCC.

Rose graduated from Plainfield High School and went to the University of St. Francis in Joliet for her four year teaching degree in reading. She received her Master's degree from the University of Illinois in English as a second language. In order to be more inclusive, Illinois gave grants to the school to provide additional assistance to non-English students. Taking the Spanish lessons with Jim helped Rose with her job as well. At some point in time, Rose and Jim were with their accountant and Rose realized she needed to be the bookkeeper for Jim's business. After 28 years of teaching, she retired in 2006, but continues to be the business bookkeeper, now on the computer.

Jim and Rose met while Jim was attending JJCC. They have been married 53 years and have two children and five grandchildren. They play Euchre, Mahjong, Fish, and go boating and visit the park pool. Jim enjoys cooking and getting the daily gossip from the people at the pool. The Phelps have been coming to Tri-Par since 1987.

U.S. Senate Soup – the Official Recipe!

This historic ham and bean soup has been on the Senate Cafeteria's menu for over 120 years!

In the early 1900s, Idaho Senator Fred Dubois passed a Resolution that the soup remain on the menu every day. This has held true, save one day during WWII when it was unavailable due to food rations. Enjoy!

Ingredients:

- 1 lb. dry navy beans
- 3/4 lb. smoked ham hock
- 2 quarts of cold water
- 1 onion, diced
- 1 Tbs. butter
- 2 tsp. kosher salt
- Pepper to taste

Directions:

- Rinse the navy beans. Place beans into large pot with 2 quarts of cold water and ham hock. Bring just to a boil, then lower to simmer and cook for 3 hours in a partially covered pot, stirring occasionally until beans are fully softened.
- 2. Remove ham hock and set aside to cool
- **3.** Lightly brown onion in butter and add to soup. Pull meat from ham hock and return to soup. Stir.
- **4.** Before serving, bring to a boil and stir in the salt and pepper.

KNOW THE RULES

State Laws

Florida Golf Cart Laws

Effective October 1, 2023, Chapter 2023-67, L.O.F. (CS/CS/HB 949) requires that a person operating a golf cart on a public road or street, as authorized by the responsible local government entity, must:

- If 18 years of age or older, possess a form of government-issued photographic identification; or
- If under 18 years of age, possess a valid learner's driver license or valid driver's license.

Sarasota County

Contracting/Licensed Contractors

Any new structure or improvements to an existing structure must be performed by a State of Florida or locally-registered Sarasota County contractor. Owner-builders can perform work with the applicable permit. To report suspected unlicensed contracting or activity, please call 941-861-5000 or Crime Stoppers at 941-366-TIPS (8477); you may remain anonymous.

ALERT Sarasota County --- REPLACES Code Red Warning System

Sarasota County has switched from Code RED to a new alert system for emergency alerts for items such as water main breaks, weather warnings, etc.

Sarasota County Code Highlights

- *Junk, Trash and Debris*: Prohibited from being left in the yard and must be disposed of properly. This includes, but is not limited to wood, tires, automobile parts, hazardous waste, abandoned property, unusable or discarded household items, inoperative or discarded machinery or equipment, motor vehicles and trailers, which are inoperative or lack current license tags, solid waste, construction or demolition materials.
- *Unlicensed, Inoperative Vehicles*: All vehicles must be operable and have current license tags or must be stored in a completely enclosed building.
- **Overweight Vehicles**: Parking, servicing repair and storage of trucks, buses, vans, and tractor trailers in excess of 6,000 pounds vehicle empty weight is prohibited in residential or open use districts.
- Living in Motor Homes or RVs in Residential Areas: It shall not be used for living, sleeping, housekeeping or business purposes and shall not be hooked to any utilities.
- **Building Permits**: Before the start of any construction or structural repair, check with the County permitting Office (861-6678) to ensure if a permit is required.

- Household Garbage and Yard Waste: All waste must be in trash cans, plastic bags or tied bundles, weighing no more than 40 pounds. Put containers out no sooner than 5 pm on the day before pickup (Sunday) and remove them by 10 am the day after (Tuesday). All containers are to be stored inside or rear yards only. You must separate yard waste from solid waste.
- **Household Hazardous Waste**: Except for motor oil and filters, hazardous waste is not collected at the curb. You must bring these types of items to a collection center, neighborhood collection or community collection program for proper disposal.
- Appliances: Residents may call the Tri-Par Scrap Pickers (Flea Market) to schedule a pick-up for an appliance or scrap metal. Please call Brad at 617-548-3343 for pick up.

Call the Sarasota Call Center (all violations) at 941-861-5000 or Code Enforcement at 941-861-6403 to report a violation of these codes.

Recycling

We are all aware of the need to cut down on our trash and the impact it has on our environment. Some activities you can undertake to reduce the impact of the waste you produce:

Waste Prevention: Avoid buying more than you need. Print only documents and emails that must be legally stored in paper form.

Waste Reduction: Avoid products with excessive packaging. Buy loose vegetables instead of pre-packed goods.

Reuse: Repurpose plastic bags. Find creative ways to transform used containers into home storage bins.

Recycle: We are all recycling in our homes, but sometimes find we are attending or running meetings or social events where the building does not have recycling facilities. (Such as our Tri-Par Clubhouse) Club leaders can arrange to have cardboard items, pop cans and steel cans taken home so that these articles can be recycled

Dogs and Cats

Sarasota County Ordinance Chapter 14 contains the regulations concerning pets and other animals. These regulations contribute to the well-being of the pets in our community and, therefore, to the well-being of us all.

- Each year you must obtain a license certificate and tag for your dog or cat. In order to receive the license, your
 pet must be vaccinated against rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The official county license may be attached
 to a collar or harness and must be worn by the dog or cat at all times.
- Your dog or cat may not run at large on any public property or the property of another and must be under the
 direct control of a responsible person. Direct control always means immediate and continuous physical control
 of an animal (dog or cat) by means of a fence, leash, cord or chain of sufficient strength to restrain the animal.
- Under no circumstances shall a person improperly tether any animal. It is unlawful to tether an animal
 outdoors, except when all 10 conditions (listed in Sarasota County Code of Ordinances, Section 14-35) are met.
 The most important condition is, "The Animal is in visual range of the Owner, and the Owner is located outside
 with the Animal."
- There have been instances when individuals are frightened by the behavior of our animals. If this occurs to you or you observe anything listed above, please report the incident to Animal Services at 941-861-9500.

F.I.S.H. Transportation (Free Medical Transportation)

Free medical transportation (via automobile) for Sarasota residents only. Donations are accepted. Rides available in the Sarasota area only. Transportation is for medical appointments only. MUST call to schedule 48 hours ahead and appointments must be between 9 a.m. and 2:30 p.m. Phone: 941-953-5838

Tri-Par Policies and Procedures

Background Check for New Owners, Renters, or Caregivers and Guests Who Stay More Than 30 Days

Background checks are required for all first-time buyers, renters, or caregivers in Tri-Par Estates. A background check is also required for first-time guests staying more than 30 days. Renters, caregivers, and guests who have left the Park for 12 months or more must reapply for a background check. A per person application form and per person \$50.00 fee must be submitted to the Tri-Par Office a minimum of 30 days prior to the desired occupancy date for processing and the Board's action. The new application form is available at the Office.

Board Approval is Required Before Moving into Tri-Par Estates

If a renter, buyer, or caregiver moves in without the Board's prior approval, the first action will be to start the process to assess a fine against the owner in accordance with Section 22 of our deed restrictions. Secondly, unapproved renters or owners will be required to vacate the property and leave the park. If they refuse and it becomes necessary for legal action to remove the unapproved occupant(s), the Board of Trustees shall be entitled to recover all costs, including, but not limited to, reasonable attorneys' fees (Section 21 of Deed Restrictions) from the property owner.

Use of Tri-Par Pool and Spa

Adult supervision is required for children under 14 years of age when at all areas of the Pool. No one under 16 is permitted in the Spa. Pool and Spa rules are posted at the pool area.

Speed Limit in Tri-Par

The speed limit throughout our Park is 20 MPH. We have many walkers, bikers, and people on their golf carts every day. For the safety of all our residents, please do your part in observing the speed limit. When you have guests, let them know we would very much appreciate their maintaining the 20 MPH speed limit within the Park.
